

CHAPTER 261.

[Published March 19, 1875.]

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter sixty-five of the general laws of 1872, entitled "An act to provide for the depositing of funds of the counties, the taxable property of which shall exceed in valuation, as fixed by the state board of equalization, the amount of thirty million (30,000,000) dollars."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter sixty-five of the general laws of 1872, entitled "An act to provide for the depositing of the funds of the counties, the taxable property of which shall exceed in valuation, as fixed by the state board of equalization, the amount of thirty millions (30,000,000) of dollars," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 2. The treasurer of any such county shall render weekly statements to the county clerk of such county of the amounts received and disbursed by him, and the balance over five thousand dollars on hand in the treasury at the end of each week, shall be deposited by such treasurer on Saturday of each week with the bank or banks or banking associations so selected, it or they giving proper vouchers therefor. From the time of so depositing such funds, and during the time such funds so deposited shall remain with such bank, banks or banking associations, such treasurer shall be relieved from all liability to the county arising from the failure of the bank, banks or banking associations safely to keep said funds. Such funds shall be drawn out only upon the check of such treasurer, countersigned by the county clerk of such county.

Amended.

Treasurer to render weekly statements and deposit balances.

How funds shall be drawn.

SECTION 2. The county treasurer of any such county shall hold no other county office, and be ineligible for two years next succeeding the termination of his office.

Treasurer ineligible to succeeding term.

SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts, contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

Conflicting acts repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
