

missioned by the Governor of the state of Wisconsin as a notary public, in and for the state of Wisconsin, to reside in Rock county, by commission bearing date the 13th day of September, A. D. 1871, and which expired on the 13th day of September, A. D. 1873, and having by mistake continued to act as such notary public until the 1st day of January, A. D. 1874, believing his said commission had not expired, all of the official acts, of the said Alfred Taggart as notary public from September 13th, 1873, to January 1st, 1874, are hereby legalized and made [as] valid to all intents and purposes, as though said Alfred Taggart had been duly appointed and commissioned as such notary public during said time.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 8.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of R. Tattreshall, a Notary Public, residing at the city of Beloit, in the county of Rock.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The official acts of R. Tattreshall, a Notary Public, residing in the city of Beloit, in the county of Rock, done in the misapprehension of the expiration of his commission as a Notary public, between the tenth day of February and the thirteenth day of March, 1874, the day of the expiration of the notarial commission, dated February 10th, 1872, and the commencement of the term of new notarial appointment, dated the 13th day of March, 1874, are hereby declared to be as legal and effective, to all intents and purposes, as if the same had been done within the legal life-time of his said herein above mentioned notarial appointment, and under, and by virtue of his said notarial commissions, or either of them. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
