

of the polls, shall constitute the board of inspectors in said ward; and the clerks of election for said ward shall be appointed and sworn in the usual manner. The two remaining supervisors of the first ward (as now constituted), together with some qualified elector of said ward to be elected *vive voce* by the voters present at the hour of opening the polls, shall constitute a board of inspectors, in and for the first ward, at the next election. And said inspector shall appoint the clerks of election in and for said ward in the usual manner, and the board of inspectors and clerks of election shall take and subscribe the usual oath prescribed by the laws of Wisconsin for said officers before entering upon the discharge of their several duties, and shall conduct said election in the same manner, and make returns thereof in the same way and at the same time as is now prescribed by law for conducting elections, canvassing votes and making return thereof for the several wards of the city of Madison, and after the first election after the passage of this act, said first and fifth wards shall be on the same footing and conduct their elections in the same manner, and elect the same class of officers in and for said ward as are now or may be hereafter elected in and for the several wards of said city.

SECTION 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 207.

[Published March 16, 1876.]

AN ACT to amend section two (2), chapter seventy-eight (78), of the general laws of 1873, entitled, "An act to amend sections seventeen (17) and eighteen (18), of chapter one hundred and thirty (130), of the general laws of 1868, entitled, 'an act to provide for the assessment of property for taxation, and the levy of taxes thereon.' "

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section two (2), of chapter seventy-eight Amended.  
(78), of the general laws of 1873, is hereby amended

by adding to said section the following: "The board of assessors shall place upon the assessment roll, opposite the name of each person liable to assessment on personal property, in a column prepared for that purpose, the number of the school district in which such personal property is subject to taxation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 208.

[Published March 16, 1876.]

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and forty-two (142), of the laws of 1875, entitled, "An act to amend section three (3), of chapter eighty-two (82), of general laws of 1870, entitled, 'an act relating to the preservation of the colors and flags of our late regiments.'"

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section one (1), of chapter one hundred and forty-two (142), of the laws of 1875, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section one (1). Section three (3), chapter eighty-two (82), general laws of 1870, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "The label shall be placed in a conspicuous place on the colors or flags, and shall state the number of the regiment, and also, briefly, the battles, sieges and campaigns in which the regiment, battery or detachment was engaged. The colors, or flags, when deposited in cases, as provided by this act, shall not be removed therefrom, except upon the application of the officer or officers commanding such regiment, battery or detachment at the time of discharge, or upon the application of the president of any military regimental organization, to be used at the reunions of any such regiment, battery or detachment, during the year 1876, and for no other purpose or purposes whatever, after which said colors or flags shall be returned to the proper custodian of the same, and not be removed therefrom, except said removal may be required for their safety or better preservation;" *provided*, that said colors or flags shall, under no circumstances, be taken beyond the limits of
