

CHAPTER 218.

[Published March 15, 1876.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of F. A. Brown, a notary public for Columbia county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The official acts of F. A. Brown, a notary public, residing in Columbia county, as done and performed by him between the first day of October, 1874, and the 15th day of February, 1876, being the interval between the expiration of his commission and new appointment, are hereby declared to be as legal and effective to all intents and purposes as if the same had been done within the legal lifetime of his said notarial appointments and under and by virtue of his notarial commissions, or either of them. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 219.

[Published March 17, 1876.]

AN ACT to improve the north branch of the Eau Claire river, in the county of Clark.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of improving the north branch of the Eau Claire river, in the county of Clark, so as to facilitate the driving and floating of logs and timber down said north branch, through and out of said county, it is hereby provided and enacted that any person, association, company or corporation, their successors or assigns, that shall have improved said branch of said river, in said county, by clearing and straightening its channel, closing sloughs, constructing piers and booms, erecting dams for the purpose of flooding and creating reservoirs of water for driving purposes, and shall keep in repair and

Parties improving river may collect toll on passing logs and timber.
