

CHAPTER 394.

[Published April 4, 1876.]

AN ACT relating to the issue of state warrants upon the requisition of the executives of other states.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fees for requisitions.

SECTION 1. The applicant for any state warrant upon the requisition of the governor of any other state or territory, upon the executive of this state, shall pay into the state treasury the same fee for the issue or ensembling of the said warrant, as is charged for a like warrant in the state from which such requisition is made.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 395.

[Published April 4, 1876.]

AN ACT relating to hawkers and peddlers, and amendatory of chapter seventy-two, of the laws of 1870.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

Persons traveling with goods to procure license.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter seventy-two of the laws of 1870, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "any goods, wares or merchandise," the words "or farmers' produce," so that said section one, when amended, shall read as follows: No person shall be allowed to travel from place to place, within this state for the purpose of carrying to sell or exposing to sale any goods, wares or merchandise or farmer's produce, unless he shall have obtained a license as hawker and peddler in the manner hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. Section seven of said chapter seventy-two, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "be found traveling or trading," the words "in the manner indicated in section one," and add to said

section seven the following words: "And it is further enacted, that one-half of the fine received in any such cases under this act shall go to the prosecutor," so that said section seven, when amended, shall read as follows: Every person who shall be found traveling or trading in the manner indicated in section one, or selling or offering to sell any patent-right or territory for sale, use or manufacture of patent-rights or articles within this state, contrary to the provisions of this chapter, contrary to the terms of any license that may have been granted to him as a hawker and peddler, patent-right dealer or public showman, shall, for each offense, be fined in a sum not exceeding fifty dollars, nor less than twenty dollars, and costs of prosecution, and in default of such payment, may be committed to the county jail for a period not exceeding three months.

Penalty for peddling without license.

SECTION 3. Section fourteen, of said chapter seventy-two, is hereby amended by inserting after the words, "to prevent any," the word "farmer," and also insert after the words, "his own work or production," the words, "either by himself or by one of his family, or any employe," and strike out the words, "having a legal residence in this state," and also strike out the words, "manufactured or grown in this state," and also strike out the words, "who is a citizen of this state," so that said section 14, when amended, shall read as follows: Section 14. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be so construed as to prevent any farmer, manufacturer, mechanic or nurseryman from selling his work or production, either by himself or by one of his family, or any employe, in any manner, without license, nor shall any patent-right dealer be required to take out a license to sell his own invention, nor shall any person traveling on foot canvassing for or selling books, pamphlets, papers or maps be required to take out the license in this chapter provided.

Amended.

Who may sell goods, etc. without license.

SECTION 4. Section sixteen, of said chapter seventy-two, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words; "and every special treasury agent appointed under the provisions of this act, shall, before entering upon the discharge of his duties as such, execute to the treasury agent a bond with sufficient sureties and in such a sum as the treasury agent may think proper," so that said section sixteen, when amended, shall read as follows: Section 16. Every special treasury agent appointed under the provisions of this act, shall, before entering upon the discharge

of his duties as such, take and subscribe an oath of office and file the same with the treasury agent, duly certified by the officers taking it; and every special treasury agent appointed under the provisions of this act, shall, before entering upon the discharge of his duties as such, execute to the treasury agent a bond with sufficient sureties, and in such a sum as the treasury agent may think proper.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 396.

AN ACT to repeal a portion of chapter one hundred and fifty-six, (156), of the private and local laws of 1869, entitled, "An act declaring Balsam Branch, Sucker Lake, and Sucker Branch, in the county of Polk, navigable for the purpose of driving logs," and also to repeal a portion of chapter four hundred and thirty (430), of the private and local laws of 1868, entitled, "an act to incorporate the Apple River Log-Driving Company."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Repealed.

SECTION 1. So much of chapter one hundred and fifty-six, of the private and local laws of 1869, entitled, "An act declaring Balsam Branch, Sucker Lake, and Sucker Branch, in the county of Polk, navigable for the purpose of driving logs," as authorizes the erection or maintenance of a dam across the mouth of Sucker Lake, in the county of Polk, is hereby repealed.

Repealed.

SECTION 2. So much of section fourteen (14), of chapter four hundred and thirty (430), of the private and local laws of 1868, entitled, "An act to incorporate the Apple River Log-Driving Company," as authorizes the Apple River Log-Driving Company or their assigns to erect and maintain a dam across Sucker Branch, at the mouth of Sucker Lake, in the county of Polk, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
