

CHAPTER 68.

[Published March 3, 1876.]

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to the Industrial School for Boys, for the purpose of introducing the manufacture of boots and shoes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the general fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), to the Industrial School for Boys, for the purpose of introducing the manufacture of boots and shoes in the institution. Appropriation.

SECTION 2. All sums appropriated by this act, shall be drawn from the treasury, on resolution of the board of managers, as needed. To be drawn as needed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT to appropriate to William P. Stowe the sum of five hundred and twenty-seven dollars (\$527) and interest from March 7, 1863.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to William P. Stowe, out of any money in the treasury belonging to the general fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five hundred and twenty-seven dollars, and interest from March 7, 1863, being in full payment for services as chaplain of the 27th regiment of Wisconsin Volunteers, while in the service of the state. Appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
