

JOINT RESOLUTIONS.

No. 1.

JOINT RESOLUTION relative to the erection, by the United States Government, of a custom-house, post-office, and other buildings at Green Bay, Wisconsin.

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the Senators and Representatives of the State of Wisconsin are requested to use all proper endeavors to procure from Congress an appropriation for the erection of suitable public buildings in the city of Green Bay, for the use of the custom-house or revenue offices there established, the post-office department, and other Federal offices and departments located in said city of Green Bay. Further

Resolved, That the secretary of state cause a copy of this resolution to be transmitted to each of the Senators and Representatives in Congress from this state.

JOINT RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, A bill was introduced in the United States Senate, on the 10th day of January, 1876, by Senator Sargeant, of California, entitled, "A bill to restore the lands, conditionally granted, the conditions of which have lapsed, to the public domain," which bill would include the grant of lands made to the State of Wisconsin, by acts of Congress, approved June 3, 1856, and May 5, 1864, "to aid in the construction of a railroad from the St. Croix river or lake, between townships twenty-five and thirty-one, to the west end of Lake Superior and Bayfield;" and,
