CHAPTER 289.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and forty-six of the laws of 1872, entitled "An act to authorize the organization of corporations for other than manufacturing, mercantile, insurance, banking, transportation or trading purposes, and of the acts amendatory thereof."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirteen of chapter one hundred and forty-six of the general laws of 1872, and acts amendatory thereof, are hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following: "A corporation, organized under this act, or any other law of the state, for the purpose of sharp-shooting or improving in the use of fire arms, may locate, acquire and possess, by lease, conveyance or otherwise, suitable grounds for practicing the art of rifle shooting, and may establish, use and maintain a rifle range for its exercises, in conformity to such rules and regulations as the corporation may deem necessary to adopt for its good government. After such grounds and range are permanently located, and improved by the erection of buildings, breastworks, ramparts or otherwise, no public street shall be opened through the tract so used or occupied, unless the necessity thereof shall be first established by verdict of a jury; nor shall any suit be maintained against such corporation to restrain, enjoin, or impede its exercises at the place so selected, on complaint of any private individuals or parties, who shall acquire title to any property adversely affected by such exercises after such grounds and range are permanently located and improved by the erection of buildings, breastworks, or ramparts as aforesaid." Vested rights.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
