pensation for their services, and the compensation of the city clerk shall not exceed the sum of one hundred dollars in any one year.

CHAPTER 242.

AN ACT amending section one thousand four hundred and sixty-five of chapter sixty, of the revised statutes, relating to agricultural societies.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

Agricultural societies entitied to state aid.

SECTION 1. Section one thousand four hundred and sixty five, of chapter sixty, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by annexing thereto the following: All societies that have complied with the previous requirements of this section for three years shall hereafter be entitled to state aid in accordance with section one thousand four hundred and sixty-three of this chapter.

CHAPTER 243.

AN ACT relating to the lighting of the capitol with the electric light.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and ussembly, do enact as follows:

Experimental light for capitol. SECTION 1. The governor is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate with manufacturers of machines for producing electric light, respecting the practicability and cost of lighting the senate and assembly chambers and the dome of the capitol building with the electric light, and he is authorized to permit any of such manufacturers to set up their machines and lamps and experiment respecting such lighting, and may permit such machines and lamps to remain in order for
