CHAPTER 63.

AN ACT to amend subdivision six of section two thousand nine hundred and eighty-two of the revised statutes of 1878, entitled of property exempt from execution.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Property ex-
empted.

SECTION 1. Subdivision six of section two thousand nine hundred and eighty-two of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "a span of" where they occur in the second and third lines of said subdivision, and inserting the word "two" in lieu thereto, so that said subdivision when amended will read as follows: Two cows, ten swine, one yote of oxen and one horse or mule; or in lieu of one yoke of oxen and a horse and mule, two horses or two mules, ten sheep and the wool from the same, either in the raw material or manufactured into yarn or cloth. The necessary food for all the stock mentioned in this section for one year's support, either provided or growing, or both, as the debtor may choose; also one wagon, cart or dray, one sleigh, one plow, one drag, and other farming utensils, including tackle for teams, not exceeding fifty dollars in value.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT to provide compensation for completing the transcribing of the journals of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
\$250.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Charles E. Bross, chief clerk of the senate, out of any money

in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, for completing the transcribing of the senate journal of the present session.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to John E. Eldred, the chief clerk of the assembly, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two hundred and seventy-five dollars, for completing the transcribing of the assembly journal of the present session. Appropriation \$275.

SECTION 3. The money hereby appropriated shall be paid by the state treasurer on the warrants of the secretary of state, which warrants shall be issued when the duties and labor herein provided for shall have been respectively performed.

CHAPTER 65.

AN ACT to amend section three hundred and seventy-eight, chapter twenty-five, of the revised statutes, entitled of the university.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section three hundred and seventy-eight, chapter twenty-five, of the revised statutes of 1878, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 378. The government of the university is hereby vested in a board of regents, to consist of one from each congressional district of the state, and two from the state at large, who shall be residents of different congressional districts, to be appointed by the governor; the state superintendent of public instruction, during his term of office; and the Honorable Cadwallader C. Washburn, for and during his good pleasure, as an honorary member of said board, with the same power as any other member. The full term of office of said regents, so appointed by the governor, shall be three years from the first Monday of February in the year in which they were or shall hereafter be appointed, unless sooner removed by the governor; but appointments to fill vacancies, before the expira-
