## CHAPTER 267.

AN ACT to authorize E. G. Cory, her associates and assigns, to build and maintain a dam across the Plover river, in Marathon county, Wisconsin.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. E. G. Cory, her associates and assigns, Location of dam are hereby authorized to build and maintain a dam across the Plover river, on the southwest fractional quarter of section nineteen (19), in township twenty-eight (28) north, of range ten (10) east, in Marathon county, Wisconsin, for the purpose of holding logs, provided that such a dam shall not raise the water to exceed four feet.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid person, her associates and assigns, shall build suitable slides in said dam for running logs, timber and lumber over the same, and shall keep the same in repair, and the same shall be kept open at all times when the river is at a driving stage and there are logs, timber or lumber to run over said dam, and shall allow to be put through said dam all logs, timber and lumber belonging to any and all other persons, free and clear of charge and expense. Use of improvements to be free

SECTION 3. The aforesaid person, her associates and assigns, shall enjoy the privilege, granted in this act, for the term of fifteen years.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 268.

AN ACT amendatory of section one thousand and forty-seven of chapter forty-eight of the revised statutes, relating to the assessment of taxes, and section one thousand one hundred and forty-three of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes, relating to the collection of taxes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one thousand and forty-seven of chapter forty-eight of the revised statutes of 1878, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following: Lands, how described in 1878. Where a more complete description may not be practicable, and a deed describing any piece of real property is recorded in the office of the register of deeds
