paid into the county treasury by the county clerk, and with such payment, he shall file with the county treasurer a certified statement, giving the number of the certificate redeemed, the date thereof, the purchase thereof, and the amount paid on such redemption, and the legal holder of any such tax certificate so redeemed, may thereafter present the same to the county treasurer and receive from him the amount paid upon such redemption of said certificate from the general fund; and said redemption money when paid into the county treasury by said county clerk, shall become a part of the general fund, and shall be disbursed as other moneys belonging to the general fund.

## CHAPTER 81.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter ninety-five of the private and local laws of 1859, entitled an act to amend an act entitled an act to incorporate the city of Ripon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Elective cfficers. SECTION 1. Amend section one of chapter ninetyfive of the private and local laws of 1859, so that the same shall read as follows: Section 1.
