Rice Lake and Lake Chetek, in the county of Barron, to a point in Polk county," and approved March 12, 1874, and a return and plat of which road as made by a majority of the commissioners and surveyor thereof, is recorded on pages five to eleven inclusive, in volume three of the records of state roads, in the office of the secretary of state, as lies wholly within section number thirty-five (35), in township number thirty-four (34), north of range number twelve (12) west, in said county of Barron, be and the same hereby is discontinued.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT to authorize S. A. Sherman to erect and maintain a dam across the Bloomer Rapids on the Wisconsin river in Portage county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. S. A. Sherman, his heirs and assigns, May maintain are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a dam across the Bloomer Rapids on the Wisconsin river on section 17, town 23, range 8 east. Provided that said dam shall be so constructed as to allow the free and safe passage of logs, timber and lumber over it without aindrance and delay; provided, said S. A. Sherman, his heirs and assigns, shall be subject to all the provisions of chapter 70 of the revised statutes of 1878, and all acts amendatory thereof, so far as the same may be applicable.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
