

mule, or in lieu of one yoke of oxen and a horse or mule, two horses or two mules, ten sheep and the wool from the same, either in the raw material or manufactured into yarn or cloth, the necessary food for all the stock mentioned in this section for one year's support, either provided or growing, or both, as the debtor may choose; also one wagon, cart or dray, one sleigh, one plow, one drag and other farming utensils, including tackle for teams not exceeding two hundred dollars in value.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to the Wisconsin Wool Growers' and Sheep Breeders' Association.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of one hundred dollars to the Wisconsin Wool Growers' and Sheep Breeders' Association for the purpose of printing and publishing the reports of said association.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 119.

AN ACT for the protection of children from abuse or criminal neglect of parents or guardians.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Protection of children.

SECTION 1. Whenever proper affidavit shall be made before any county judge in the state of Wisconsin, that the life, health or safety of any child in such county is seriously endangered by continuous neglect, abuse or criminal treatment by the parent, guardian or by any person having the custody of such child, it shall be the duty of such county judge to summon witnesses as to the facts set forth in such complaint;
