## CHAPTER 300.

AN ACT to authorize the county of Adams to grant certain lands and other property to aid in the construction of railroada.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The county of Adams by its board of Construct. supervisors, is hereby authorized to subscribe to the capital stock and to aid in the building and construction of any railroad running into or through said county, and for that purpose may sell, grant and convey to the individual, company or corporation building and constructing, or that shall build and construct such railroad, any or all of the lands and tax certificates owned by said county, upon such terms; conditions and covenants, as shall be agreed to by said supervisors. The authority and powers hereby granted to said board of supervisors may be exercised at any regular meeting or at any special meeting of said board duly called for that purpose. Nothing contained in this section shall be held to affect or abridge any authority conferred by any other law of this state upon said county, to aid in the construction of railroads.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 301.

AN ACT relating to the Wisconsin National Guard, and amendatory of section 635 of revised statutes.

SECTION 1.
