CHAPTER 214.

AN ACT to prescribe the manner of carrying into effect the provisions of section 408, of chapter 26, of the revised statutes relating to teachers' institutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to draw his warrant, payable to the treasurer of the board of regents of normal schools, for the several appropriations made by section 408 of the revised statutes for the years 1878, 1879, 1880 and 1881, upon the certificate of the president and secretary of said board of regents, that the same has been expended in each of said years for the purposes designated in said section; and said secretary of state shall annually, upon presentation to him of the certificate of the president and secretary of said board of regents of normal schools, of the amount expended for the purposes mentioned in said section 408, draw his warrant for the amount, payable as above provided, such warrant not to exceed the sum of two-sevenths (2-7) of the amount so certified to as actually expended.

CHAPTER 215.

AN ACT to authorize the governor and commissioners of public lands to adjust and settle differences between the state and any land grant railway companies in the state, in relation to lands claimed as swamp lands within the limits of such railway grants.
