CHAPTER 290.

AN ACT to amend section 2081 of chapter 96 of revised statutes, entitled "Of uses and trusts."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Add to section 2081 of the revised statutes, as follows: 6. For perpetually keeping in repair and preserving any tomb, monument or grave stone, or any cemetery, to an amount not exceeding two thousand dollars (\$2,000); and any cemetery company, association or corporation is authorized to receive money or property to the amount aforesaid, in trust for the purpose aforesaid, and to apply the income thereof to the purposes of the trust. relating to uses and trusts.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved April 2, 1883.

CHAPTER 291.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the State Board of Charities and Reform to employ temporary clerical assistance.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever the State Board of Charities and Reform shall determine that additional clerical assistance is necessary to the proper discharge of their duties, they may employ some person or persons to perform such service as may be required, at such compensation as may be agreed upon, and the accounts for such services shall be approved by said board and attested by certificate thereon of the president thereof, and when so certified, shall be audited by the secretary of state, and paid out of the state treasury. The State Board of Charities and Reform, or some member, or the secretary thereof, are hereby required to visit each county insane asylum in this state at least once in each three months during each and every year, and may also designate some suitable person or persons to make visits thereto, whose expenses only may be audited and paid each year as herein provided to audit bills for clerical assistance, and out of the amount of money May employ temporary clerical assistance.

herein appropriated, and it is hereby made the duty of the governor to re-organize the said State Board of Charities and Reform, whenever in his opinion, to do so would increase its efficiency and harmony, and be beneficial to the interests of the people.

Appropriation.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury annually, a sum sufficient to pay the expenses hereby authorized.

SECTION 3. The sum hereby authorized to be expended shall not exceed the sum of five hundred dollars in any one year.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 292.

AN ACT relating to the powers of towns and town boards containing unincorporated villages.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to powers of towns and town boards.

SECTION 1. All powers relating to villages and conferred upon village boards by the provisions of chapter 40, of the revised statutes, and all acts amendatory thereof, excepting those, the exercise of which, would conflict with the provisions of law relative to towns and town boards, are hereby conferred upon towns and town boards of towns, containing one or more unincorporated villages, having each a population of not less than one thousand inhabitants, and are made applicable to such unincorporated village or villages, and may be exercised therein when directed by a resolution of the qualified electors of the town, at the last preceding annual town meeting.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
