CHAPTER 90.

AN ACT to provide for the sale of the Nicodemus and Conover map of the state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The state superintendent is hereby authorized and empowered to sell the Nicodemus and Conover map of the state of Wisconsin, one copy each, to any school district, teacher, high school, town or county officer or member of the legislature in this state desiring to purchase the same for any public use, or for use in any of the schools in this state, at a price not less than two dollars per copy; and all moneys received by said superintendent for said maps so sold shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the general fund. The maps offered for sale by this act, shall, prior to such sale and delivery, be revised and corrected in accordance with the latest changes made in the boundary lines of counties, and existing at the time of such delivery, and the secretary of state is hereby authorized to employ a competent draughtsman to make the corrections required.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 91.

AN ACT to authorize Hans Johnson to build piers into the waters of Lake Michigan.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Hans Johnson, his heirs or assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain three piers or more into the waters of Lake Michigan from lot number three (3), section twenty-one (21), town thirty-two (32), range twenty-nine (29) east, in Door county. Said piers to extend into Lake Michigan a distance of from five to fifteen hundred feet.

May build a pier.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
