CHAPTER 62.

AN ACT relating to the swamp lands located in Marathon county, and amendatory of chapter 261, of the laws of 1880.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Swamp lands
in Marathon
county.

SECTION 1. All swamp lands heretofore conveyed to Marathon county, by virtue of chapter 261, of the laws of 1880, shall be the absolute and unconditional property of said county, with full power to sell and dispose of the same, upon such terms and conditions as the county board of supervisors of said county shall prescribe, and to protect the same from trespassers, and to apply the proceeds thereof, exclusively to the purpose of reclaiming said lands by means of drains, ditches and highways as provided by law.

SECTION 2. So much of chapter 261, laws of 1880, conflicting with this act, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 63.

AN ACT relating to attorneys and admission to the bar, and amendatory of section 2586, of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision 3, of section 2586, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 144, of the laws of 1881, is hereby amended so that said subdivision, when amended, shall read as follows: 3. Every other person who shall be of full age, a resident of this state, and of good moral character, may be admitted to practice as an attorney in all courts of record, except the supreme court, by
