CHAPTER 93.

AN ACT to amend section 436, of the revised statutes of 1878, relating to common schools.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section 436, of the revised statutes of 1878, is hereby amended by striking out the words, "when authorized by a district meeting," where they occur in the fifth line of said section, so that said section when so amended shall read as follows: Section 436. The said board shall have power to purchase a record book and such other books, blanks and stationery as may be necessary to keep a record of the proceedings of the district meetings, and the account of the treasurer, and for doing the business of the district in an orderly manner, and such maps, charts, globes and school apparatus as have been or may be approved as suitable for use of the schools, by the state superintendent or by the county superintendent of the county, not exceeding seventy-five dollars in value in any one year, and such school books, as in their judgment, may be necessary for the use of any children attending in their district, whose parents and guardians may not be able to furnish the same. All such purchases shall be unanimously approved at a regular meeting of said board, at which all the members thereof shall be present. The district board shall keep an accurate account of all expenses incurred by them under the provisions of this section, and present an itemized statement of the purchases to the annual school district meeting.

Relating to purchase of books, etc., for common schools.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
