CHAPTER 115.

AN ACT to confer certain power upon cemetery associations.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Certain powers conferred on cemetery associations.

SECTION 1. Any cemetery association or corporation which shall have been organized under any general or special law of this state, shall have power and authority to make such regulations as it may deem expedient, for the protection, improvement, preservation, management and control of their respective cemeteries, and to compel any lot owner or occupant to fill in, level up or raise any lot, clean off, trim up and remove grass, bushes or trees, and otherwise change any lot in such cemetery in conformity to such regulations, and to compel any lot owner or occupant to remove any substance or thing erected or planted therein, in violation of any such regulations, and to fix a penalty not exceeding ten dollars for any one violating any by-law, rule or regulations of such cemetery association, adopted by the trustees thereof.

Forfeitures, how paid.

SECTION 2. All forfeitures imposed by any by-law, rule or regulations of any such cemetery association or corporation, may be paid for and recovered pursuant to chapter 142, revised statutes, and acts amendatory thereof.

Conferring certain powers on trustees and superintendent.

SECTION 3. Each trustee and the superintendent or sexton of any cemetery association or corporation shall have the same powers as are conferred by law upon constables, in the enforcement of any by-law, rule or regulation of such cemetery association or corporation.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
