CHAPTER 176.

AN ACT to authorize J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, to construct and maintain a dam across Yellow river in Barron county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a dam across Yellow river, in Barron county, on land now owned or which shall hereafter be acquired by purchase or lease by said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs or assigns, on the northwest quarter of section twenty-seven, in township thirty-four north, of range twelve west;

said dam to be constructed for hydraulic, manufacturing and boomage purposes; and the said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns are authorized to erect and maintain mills, machinery and necessary appendages to enable them to use the water of said river for the aforesaid purposes; provided, that said dam shall not raise the water to exceed eight feet or to interfere with any other dam now erected on said river above such location.

To build slides,
etc.

SECTION 2. The said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, shall build suitable slides in said dam for running logs and timber over the same, and shall keep the same in repair. The same shall be kept open at all times when the said river is at a driving stage, and there are logs and timber to run over said dam. The said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, may erect and maintain booms for the sorting of logs passing into the mill pond hereby authorized to be created; provided, that said booms shall be constructed so as to allow free passage of logs or timber; and that the said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns shall put through the reservoir created by said dam, all logs and timber owned or controlled by any other persons or corporations free and clear of all costs and expense without hindrance or delay, and shall maintain a sufficient head of water for that purpose; and in event of any failure to carry out the provisions of this act, the said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns shall be liable for any and all damages sustained by reason of such failure; and provided further, that the provisions of this act shall not interfere with full and free enjoyment by any persons, and their heirs and assigns of any and all rights and privileges heretofore granted to them.

Control of dam.

SECTION 3. The control of said dam and slides shall belong to the said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, but subject always to the provisions of section 2, of this act.

SECTION 4. The dam so erected shall be subject to all the provisions of chapter 146, of the revised statutes of 1878, and acts amendatory thereof, so far as said chapter and acts amendatory may be applied, in like manner as if such provisions were incorporated in this act; provided, however, tha

the said J. W. Taylor, his associates, heirs and assigns, for the purpose of ascertaining the compensation to be made for overflowing or otherwise injuring the lands of others, may, within six months from and after the construction of said dam and the placing of gates therein, proceed according to the provisions of chapter 318, of the laws of 1882, and acts amendatory thereof, and the commencement of such proceedings shall, during the pendency thereof, and after an award thereunder, be a bar to any action commenced by the owner or owners of such overflowed or injured lands, or any part thereof, or any interest therein; and for such purpose the said chapter 318, and acts amendatory thereof, are hereby made applicable as fully as if the provisions thereof were incorporated in this act.

SECTION 5. The legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal the franchises granted in this act, whenever, in the judgment of the legislature it is necessary or proper to do so.

Right to alter, amend or repeal reserved.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 177.

AN ACT to authorize Frederick Petterson, his associates, heirs and assigns, to construct and maintain a dam across Trade river, in Burnett county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Frederick Petterson, his associates, heirs, and assigns, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a dam across Trade river, in Burnett county, on land now owned, or which shall hereafter be acquired by purchase or lease, by said Frederick Petterson, or by him and his associates, on the west half of the northeast quarter
