CHAPTER 178.

AN ACT to authorize Samuel Harriman, Geo. P. Anderson and Abram Johnson, their heirs and assigns, to erect and maintain a dam across Blake's Lake, in Polk county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Samuel Harriman, George P. Anderson and Abram Johnson, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a dam, not to exceed eight feet in height, across the narrows of Blake's Lake, on section twenty-six, town thirty-five, range sixteen in the county of Polk, and state of Wisconsin.

Sam Harriman et al. to build dam across Blake's lake, Polk county.

SECTION 2. Said dam shall be built with suitable slides therein for running logs and timber over the same; and the owners of said dam shall keep the same in repair and open at all times when the water in said lake is at a driving stage, and there are logs or timber to be driven over said dam, except when it may be necessary to hold the water in said dam for the purpose of accumulating water therein for driving or flooding purposes.

Build suitable slides, etc.

SECTION 3. The said Samuel Harriman, George P. Anderson and Abram Johnson, their heirs and assigns, for the purpose of acquiring the land necessary for the erection and maintenance of said dam, and the flowage rights they may deem necessary to successfully carry out the provisions of this act, may exercise all the powers granted to corporations by section 1777, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 518, of the laws of Wisconsin, for the year 1882.

May exercise powers granted by section 1777, R. S.

SECTION 4. The right to repeal and amend this act is hereby reserved. All acts and parts of acts, so far as they conflict with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

Right to repeal and amend reserved.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
