## CHAPTER 377.

AN ACT to authorize George S. Davis and others to improve a portion of the Little Black river.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Authorizing  
Geo. S. Davis  
to maintain a  
dam on Little  
Black river,  
Taylor county.

SECTION 1. George S. Davis and his successors and assigns, are hereby authorized to maintain the dam built on Little Black river in Taylor county, Wisconsin, on the south west quarter of the south-west quarter of section one, in township thirty north, of range one east, under chapter 289, of the laws of Wisconsin for the year 1883, upon lands owned or leased by him or them, and otherwise improve said river and its tributaries above said dam by cleaning and straightening its channel and by building and maintaining such other dam or dams on the portion aforesaid of such river, upon lands owned or leased by him or them as shall facilitate and make reasonably certain and practicable the driving of logs down and out of such portion of said river.

SECTION 2. All said dams shall contain a suitable slide and gates for the purpose of sluicing logs through and over the same and shall be kept in good repair and operated for the purpose of facilitating the driving of logs and timber down and out of said Little Black river; and, whenever necessary, an open space shall be kept through the pond which shall be created by said dams or any of them, suitably located, and of sufficient width, to permit, without unreasonable delay, the passage of logs and timber through the said openings when there is sufficient water in said river for driving purposes.

SECTION 3. When said dams and other improvements shall have been maintained and constructed as above provided, so as to render the floating of logs and timber down and out of said river from above the dam first above mentioned reasonably certain and practicable, said George S. Davis, and his successors and assigns, in consider-

ation of the building, maintaining and operating said dams and other improvements, shall be entitled to charge, sue for, and collect as tolls, on all logs and timber now in, or hereinafter put into said Little Black river or its tributaries above the dam first mentioned in this act, and driven down and out of such portion of said river by the aid of said dam or dams above provided for, or any of them, the sum of twenty-five cents for each one thousand feet thereof, board measure.

SECTION 4. The tolls authorized by the provisions of this act shall be a lien on all logs and timber driven through or over the dams and any of them above mentioned, for the amount thereof, at the rate aforesaid, and shall be enforceable in the same manner as liens for labor on logs under the revised statutes, and the acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto. And the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal this act at any future session thereof. Lien fer tolls.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 378.

AN ACT to amend section 2513, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 200, laws of 1879, relating to municipal court of Milwaukee county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 2513, of the revised statutes of Wisconsin, as amended by chapter 200, of the laws of 1879, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 2513. The salary of said judge shall be three thousand six hundred dollars per annum; of said clerk, two thousand five hundred dollars per annum; and of said deputy clerk, one thousand five hundred dollars per annum; all Amending section 2513, municipal court, Milwaukee county.
