### CHAPTER 3.

AN ACT to appropriate money for the purchase of stationery for the use of the state.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars, for the purchase of stationery for the use of state officers and departments for the years 1887 and 1888, and for the legislative session of 1889; said sum being the amount estimated to be necessary for the purpose specified.

Appropriating  
\$7,500 for stationery.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 4.

AN ACT authorizing the city of Ripon to purchase certain real estate, and to authorize the commissioners of public lands to loan a portion of the trust funds to the city of Ripon.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The city of Ripon, in the state of Wisconsin, is hereby authorized to purchase and hold in its corporate name, lots two and three, of block nine, of Ripon plat, in the city of Ripon, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, and for the purpose of paying for the same, the city hall block erected thereon, and the indebtedness of said city, the said city of Ripon is hereby authorized and empowered, upon the faith and credit of the said

City authorized to purchase real estate, to build city hall, and borrow from trust fund not exceeding \$15,000 to pay for same.

city, to borrow a sum of money, not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars, upon a period of time not exceeding ten years, and at such a rate of interest, not exceeding seven per cent., as may be agreed upon. And said city of Ripon is hereby authorized to issue to the commissioners of public lands of this state, or to the party or parties of whom said money is borrowed, certificates of indebtedness for the sum so borrowed. The interest on said indebtedness shall be paid annually, and the principal sum so loaned shall be paid as follows: Fifteen hundred dollars in one year; fifteen hundred dollars in two years; fifteen hundred dollars in three years; fifteen hundred dollars in four years; fifteen hundred dollars in five years; fifteen hundred dollars in six years; fifteen hundred dollars in seven years; fifteen hundred dollars in eight years; fifteen hundred dollars in nine years; fifteen hundred dollars in ten years from the date of said loan.

Raise annual tax to pay interest.

SECTION 2. Said city of Ripon shall annually, during the continuance of said loan, raise by tax, on the taxable property in said city, a sum of money sufficient to pay the interest thereon and one-tenth of the principal of said sum, and the city clerk of said city shall insert said amount in the tax roll of said city, and the same shall be collected as other taxes are collected, and when so collected shall be applied to the object herein specified and no other.

Commissioners of public lands authorized to make loan.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of carrying into effect the foregoing provisions and assisting said city to raise said sum of money for the object aforesaid, the commissioners of the public lands of the state of Wisconsin are hereby authorized to loan to said city of Ripon, out of any of the trust funds in their charge and under their control, a sum of money not exceeding the amount stated in the first section of this act, and for the term of years and at such rate of interest, not exceeding seven per cent., as may be agreed upon, and upon such certificates of indebtedness of said city of Ripon as said commissioners shall prescribe and require, and all the taxable property in said city shall stand charged for the payment of the said loan, and the interest thereon, at the times and in the manner hereinbefore specified, and it shall be the duty of the secretary of state, at the

time he shall certify to the county clerk the amount of state taxes, also to certify to the city clerk, of the city of Ripon, the amount that shall be due, or become due, for that year, for principal and interest on said loan, and the city clerk of said city of Ripon shall thereupon insert the amount so certified in the tax roll of said city, as a tax upon said city, without any further or other authority, to be collected as other taxes are collected, and, by the treasurer of said city, paid over to the state treasurer upon such loan.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 5.

AN ACT relating to millers' and manufacturers' mutual insurance corporations and amendatory of section 1941c of the revised statutes.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1941c of the revised statutes is hereby so amended that the same shall read as follows, that is to say: Section 1941c. Such corporation, when duly organized, and on receiving the certificate of the commissioner, may issue policies of insurance on mills and manufactories, the stock and products thereof, and the property contained in and about such mills and manufactories, or kept or used in connection therewith, and on warehouses and elevators and their contents, for any time not exceeding five years, and not extending beyond the time such corporation is to continue, and for any amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars, on any one risk. Any such corporation may classify the property insured at the time of insuring the same under different rates, corresponding as nearly as may be, to the greater or less risk from fire and loss which may
