## CHAPTER 519.

AN ACT to amend chapter 432, of the laws of 1885, entitled, "an act to authorize the city of Milwaukee to raise a special tax in the south sewerage district of said city."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 432, of the laws Authorizing of 1885, entitled, "an act to authorize the city of ket to issue Milwaukee to raise a special tax in the south sew-special tax in the south sew-special tax in the south sew-rage erage district of said city," is hereby amended to district and read as follows: Section 1. The common council tion 1, chapter of the city of Milwaukee is hereby authorized to 482, laws 1885. levy and raise by taxation, upon all the taxable property, real and personal, within the south sewerage district of said city, in addition to the amount authorized to be raised for a sewerage fund in said district, and in addition to the amount of money authorized to be raised by taxation for all purposes within said district, now limited by law for each of the years 1885, 1886, 1887, a sum of money not exceeding one mill on the dollar in each of said years, upon all of the taxable property within said district, for the purpose of continuing and completing the sewers contemplated by the plans for sewers in said south sewerage district of said city, now on file in the offices of the proper officers of said city of Milwaukee, and for the purpose of continuing the construction of such sewers as shall or may be included in any aniendments to, or changes of the said plans during the years 1885, 1886, 1887; provided, that the first funds derived from said tax shall be applied to the construction of a sewer to relieve Mineral street sewer.

Section 2, All acts and parts of acts, so far as Repeal. they contravene the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved April 14, 1887.
