

and responsibilities as to the estate remaining undisposed of, and proceedings remaining to be taken, as if appointed by the instrument of assignment.

SECTION 2. There is hereby created a new section to be known as section 1702c, of the revised statutes of 1878, which shall read and be as follows: Section 1702c. The assignee of every voluntary assignment shall make and file with the clerk of the circuit court of the county where such assignment is made at least once in every year during the continuance of his trust, a full and itemized statement, verified by his oath of the condition of all the property and funds held by him as such assignee, and of all receipts, expenses and disbursements in any way connected with said trust, including his own charges as such assignee.

Creating section 1702c— Assignee to file statement of condition of trust with clerk of circuit court.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 549.

AN ACT to regulate factories, workshops and other places of employment.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. No person, persons or corporation shall employ and put to work in any factory, workshop or other place of employment, or in any room or other part of such factory, workshop or other place of employment, more persons than the laws of health will warrant, as shall be determined by the board of health.

Regulating number of persons that may be employed in factories, etc.

SECTION 2. Every stationery vat, pan or other structure with molten metal or hot liquids shall be surrounded with proper safeguards for preventing accidents or injury to those employed at or

near them. All belting, shafting, gearing, hoists, fly-wheels, elevators and drums of manufacturing establishments so located as to be dangerous to employes when engaged in their ordinary duties shall be securely guarded or fenced so as to be safe to persons employed in any such place of employment.

Penalty for failure to comply.

SECTION 3. Any person, company or corporation who shall refuse or fail to comply with the provisions of this act, shall forfeit not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each offense, and every day's failure after the first conviction shall constitute a separate offense, after due notice by the state factory inspector.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 550.

AN ACT to amend chapter 184, of laws 1881, entitled, "an act to provide for the laying out of a state road from Ahnapee, Kewaunee county," to intersect the Green Bay and Sturgeon Bay state road in the town of Nassewaupee, Door county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

G. G. Berge, et al., appointed commissioners to lay out state road.

SECTION 1. G. G. Berge, of Clay Banks, John Keogh, of Forestville, Door county, and August Harmann, of the town of Ahnapee, Kewaunee county, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road, commencing at a point in the town of Ahnapee, Kewaunee county, where the section line between sections twenty-three and twenty-four strikes the lake shore road between the city of Ahnapee and the city of Sturgeon Bay; thence north on the section line between sections twenty-three and twenty-four, thirteen and fourteen, and eleven and twelve, to the north
