## CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT to authorize Benjamin Heinemann and others to build and maintain dams, booms and other improvements on Montreal river.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of improving the Authorizing navigation of the Montreal river, Benjamin Benjamin Heiremann to Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, is hereby author- Montreal river. ized and empowered to build, maintain and operate a dam or dams across said river, at such point or points as he may select, also to construct, maintain and operate a boom or booms for the handling and sorting of logs, timber, rails, fence posts, ties and other materials that may be floated down said stream, and to otherwise improve said river at such point or points as said Benjamin Heinemann may decide upon.

SECTION 2. All dams authorized by this act Dams, how shall be constructed and maintained with suitable etc. gates and sluices for the passage of logs over the same, and the management and control of the water collected therein in aid of the navigation of said river. All such dams, booms, and other improvements constructed or maintained upon said river by said Benjamin Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, under the provisions of this act, shall at all times be under the exclusive control of said Benjamin Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, and shall be so controlled and managed as, in the judgment of said Benjamin Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, will best subserve the interests of all parties engaged in driving logs, or conducting other business upon said river.

As compensation for improvement May collect SECTION 3. of said Montreal river, when said Benjamin Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, shall have constructed and shall maintain dams, booms, or other improvements hereby authorized, he shall be entitled and he is hereby empowered and authorized to demand, receive, levy, sue for and collect as a toll, a

fair and reasonable amount upon all logs, timber, rails, posts or other materials floated through said dams, or held, sorted, handled, rafted or delivered by him, in or from said boom or booms, and for such toll shall have the lien upon the logs, timber or material for which the same are incurred, given by section 1777, of chapter 86, of the revised statutes and the acts amendatory thereof, and may enforce the same as provided by said section and its amendatory acts.

May exercise

powers granted SECTION 4. Said Benjamin Heinemann, his powers from 1777, heirs or assigns, for the purpose of acquiring any R.S. SECTION 4. Said Benjamin Heinemann, his flowage rights that they may deem necessary in carrying out the provisions of this act, may exercise all the powers granted to corporations by section 1777, chapter 86, of the revised statutes.

Right to amend or repeal reserved.

Section 5. The legislature reserves the right to amend or repeal this act whenever in its judg-

ment the public interest may require.

## CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT relating to live stock on public highways, and amendatory of subdivision 3, of section 776, of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amending subdivision 3, section 776,

Section 1. Subdivision 3, of section 776, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding to the end thereof, the following: And hereafter, whenever at any town meeting it shall have been voted by a majority of the electors to restrain the live stock as above provided, and hy-laws have been made and duly published a shove required, it shall become the duty of the constables of such town to duly impound such stock and receive such fees as shall be fixed by such by-laws for such services so performed.
