

fair and reasonable amount upon all logs, timber, rails, posts or other materials floated through said dams, or held, sorted, handled, rafted or delivered by him, in or from said boom or booms, and for such toll shall have the lien upon the logs, timber or material for which the same are incurred, given by section 1777, of chapter 86, of the revised statutes and the acts amendatory thereof, and may enforce the same as provided by said section and its amendatory acts.

May exercise powers granted by section 1777, R. S.

SECTION 4. Said Benjamin Heinemann, his heirs or assigns, for the purpose of acquiring any flowage rights that they may deem necessary in carrying out the provisions of this act, may exercise all the powers granted to corporations by section 1777, chapter 86, of the revised statutes.

Right to amend or repeal reserved.

SECTION 5. The legislature reserves the right to amend or repeal this act whenever in its judgment the public interest may require.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT relating to live stock on public highways, and amendatory of subdivision 3, of section 776, of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amending subdivision 3, section 776, R. S.

SECTION 1. Subdivision 3, of section 776, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding to the end thereof, the following: And hereafter, whenever at any town meeting it shall have been voted by a majority of the electors to restrain the live stock as above provided, and by-laws have been made and duly published as above required, it shall become the duty of the constables of such town to duly impound such stock and receive such fees as shall be fixed by such by-laws for such services so performed.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts so far as they conflict with this act are hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force upon and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 70.

AN ACT to authorize W. H. Richards, to erect and maintain a dam across the Big Eau Pleine river, in the county of Marathon.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. W. H. Richards his heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to erect, keep up and maintain a dam across the Big Eau Pleine river, on the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of section number four, in township number twenty-seven, north of range number three, in the county of Marathon, on lands owned by the said W. H. Richards, said dam not to exceed nine feet in height. Authorizing W. H. Richards to build a dam.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid W. H. Richards, his associates, heirs and assigns, shall build suitable slides in said dam for running logs and timber over the same and shall keep the same in repair. The same shall be kept open at all times when said river is at a driving stage, and there are logs or timber to be run over said dam. To build suitable slides, etc.

SECTION 3. The dam so erected shall be subject to all the provisions of chapter 146, of the revised statutes and acts amendatory thereof, so far as said chapter and acts amendatory may be applied, in like manner as if such provisions were incorporated in this act. To be subject to provisions of chapter 146, R. S.

SECTION 4. The right to alter, amend or repeal this act is hereby reserved. Right to amend or repeal reserved.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
