

provided by a vote of the district, duly recorded, at the last previous annual meeting. If the first Monday in July is a legal holiday, then said annual meeting shall be held on the day next succeeding the first Monday in July. It shall be the duty of the district board of each school district in this state to meet on the Saturday immediately preceding the first Monday of July in each year, and carefully examine the accounts of the treasurer, and make up a full and itemized report of all receipts and expenditures since the last annual meeting, the amount in the hands of the treasurer, or the amount of the deficit for which the district is liable, and the estimated sum which will be required to be raised by taxes for the support of the school for the ensuing year, and the amount required to pay the interest or principal of any loan due or to become due during such year; which report shall be submitted in writing at the annual meeting, and recorded at length, with the action of the meeting thereon, by the clerk, with the records of the proceedings of the annual meeting.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 97.

AN ACT relating to excise and the application of the provisions of chapter 296, of the laws of 1885, to the town of Superior, in the county of Douglas.

WHEREAS, At the time provided by law for the taking of the last enumeration of the inhabitants by the state, the town of Superior in the county of Douglas, had within its boundary an unincorporated village with a population of more than five hundred; and

WHEREAS, In the taking of such enumeration in said town the inhabitants of such village were

not separately enumerated; wherefore no record, official or unofficial, of the population of such village is preserved; therefore

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Provisions of chap. 296, laws 1885, made applicable to the town of Superior, Douglas county.

SECTION 1. In the application of the provisions of chapter 296, of the laws of 1885, to said town of Superior, said town shall be deemed and taken to have had within its boundary, at the time of the taking of the last enumeration of the inhabitants by the state, an unincorporated village with a population of more than five hundred.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 98.

AN ACT to facilitate the sale of state swamp lands in Crawford county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorizing sale of swamp land in Crawford county.

SECTION 1. The commissioners of the public lands are hereby authorized and required to offer for sale the swamp lands held by the state in the county of Crawford, at a minimum price of one dollar and fifty cents per acre.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
