CHAPTER 394.

AN ACT to authorize John S. Owen, his assigns, or legal representatives, to construct and maintain dams on Long lake branch of White river, Long lake and the intermediate lakes on said branch and the tributaries of said branch, for hydraulic, log driving and other purposes, and to improve the navigation of said waters.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Dams on White river, Long lake, etc., Bayfield county.

How built, etc.

SECTION 1. John S. Owen, his assigns and legal representatives, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain dams at any points on Long lake branch of White river, Long lake and the intermediate lakes on said branch, and on the tributaries of said branch above the east line of section thirteen, of town forty-five north, of range seven west, in Bayfield county, Wisconsin, on lands owned or controlled by them. Said dams to be constructed for the purpose of facilitating the driving of logs and timber down said lakes and streams. Suitable slides, however, to be built in said dams for running logs and timber belonging to any and all other parties over the same, free of all expense or charges. And they are hereby authorized, by means of the said dams, or of dams heretofore constructed and owned by them or any of them, to take possession of the water

in said streams and lakes, and hold back and control and use the same for the purpose of log driving. And in aid of said purposes they may and shall have and possess all powers and privileges conferred by section 1777, of the revised statutes, and the acts amendatory thereof, upon corporations organized under said revised statutes for similar purposes or for the purpose of the improvement of the navigation of streams.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts so far as they conflict with or interfere with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. The right to alter, amend or repeal this act is hereby reserved to the legislature. Right reserved.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 395.

AN ACT to legalize the vote of the town of Clear Lake, Polk county, relating to the township system of school government.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The vote of the qualified electors in the town of Clear Lake, Polk county, at the annual town meeting, April 2d, 1889, on the question of abolishing the township system of school government, is hereby declared to be as valid in all respects as if the petition had been signed and the notices given within the time and manner provided in section 552, of the revised statutes. Legalizing vote in town of Clear Lake abolishing township system of school government.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
