CHAPTER 53.

AN ACT to extend the provisions of chapter 205, of the laws of 1891, entitled, "An act to provide for the purchase and distribution of Sanborn and Berryman's Annotated Statutes, and to appropriate money therefor."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The provisions of section 1, of Provisions of chapter 205, of the laws of 1891, are hereby ex-laws of 1891, tended and continued in force for the purpose of extended to supplying such offices, institutions, towns, cities towns, etc. and villages therein mentioned as have been created or organized since the distribution of the statutes therein provided was made, or as may hereafter be created or organized, with the Annotated Statutes of Wisconsin, upon the same terms and conditions, and subject to all the provisions of said chapter, except that no village which has been supplied with statutes pursuant to that chapter, and which has since been or may hereafter be organized as a city, shall be supplied under the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out Appropriation. of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay for the statutes which may be purchased pursuant to this statute, and also a sum sufficient to pay for the copies of said Annotated Statutes which have been furnished this legislature pursuant to joint resolution number three, senate; provided, that the price per copy of said statutes delivered in the city of Madison, shall not exceed four dollars and fifty cents per volume. The provisions of section 3, of chapter 205, of the laws of 1891, shall govern the auditing of the accounts which may be rendered pursuant to this chapter.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
