CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT amending section 3840, of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 171, of the laws of 1893, relating to county courts.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Time limited when creditors may present their claims for examination. Frocedure of the court.

Section 3840, of the revised stat-SECTION 1. utes of Wisconsin, as amended by chapter 171, laws of 1893, is hereby amended so as to read Section 3840. At the time of grantas follows: ing letters testamentary or of administration, the county court, by order, shall fix a time, not less than six months, nor more than one year thereafter, as the circumstances of the case may require, within which creditors shall present their claims for examination and allowance. For good cause shown upon such notice to the executor or administrator, or other parties in interest as the court may direct, and not later than sixty days after the expiration of the time fixed as aforesaid, such time may be extended, but not beyond two years from the date of the letters testamentary or of administration. court shall fix also by said order, a time after the presentation of claims for the examination and adjustment of any claims presented. Notice of the time within which creditors may present their claims, and of the time when the same will be examined and adjusted by the court, shall be given by publication, as provided in section 4050, for four consecutive weeks, or in such other manner as the court may direct, the first publication to be made within fifteen days of the date of said order. At the time so fixed for examining and adjusting claims, the court may, if necessary, adjourn the hearing to such other time and from time to time thereafter as may be convenient until the examination and adjustment be completed.

AN ACT relating to notices to lot owners of special assessments for sewer purposes of cities of the third class, incorporated under special charters.

In all cities of the third class, in-Notice of special assessments against whole or any part of the cost of a sewer to be lots for sewers, etc. paid for by special assessments against lots or parcels of land fronting or abutting upon such sewer, the board of public works, as soon as the assessment against the lots or parcels of land fronting or abutting on such sewer shall be made, shall give notice to all parties inter-
