The governor of the state of Wisconsin shall appoint an inspector of lumber district number sixteen, who shall reside and keep his office in the village of Tomahawk, in Lincoln county, Wisconsin, and shall be responsible for his acts and the acts of his deputies, the same as now provided by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 36.

AN ACT to provide for the payment by the clerk of the municipal and police courts of the city of Milwaukee to the city treasurer, all bail moneys deposited with him which remain uncalled for, for two years.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Forfeited bail moneys to be paid into city treasury every two years.

SECTION 1. The clerk of the municipal court and of the police court of the city of Milwaukee is hereby authorized and directed to annually deposit in the city treasury of said city all forfeited bail moneys deposited with him which shall remain uncalled for, or otherwise

undisposed of, for a term of two years next preceding; also all bail moneys deposited which shall remain in his hands and uncalled for, for a period of two years after conviction.

SECTION 2. At the time said clerk shall deposit said moneys in the city treasury, he shall file a detailed statement of the same with the city comptroller, which detailed statement shall show by whom said bail was deposited and for what purpose, together with the date that such deposit was made.

Detailed statement of same to be made to the city comptroller.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 37.

AN ACT providing for the granting of certain land for a highway therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby granted to the supervisors of the town of Westport, in the county of Dane, for the purposes of a public highway, a strip of land forty (40) feet wide, part of the grounds of the Wisconsin state hospital for the insane, described as follows, viz.: That part of the southeast quarter of section 26, town 8, north, range 9, east, bounded by a line commencing at a point in the east and west quarter line of said section 26 at its intersection with the southwesterly line of the right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern
