

chosen from members of the company, and keep a record of all their proceedings in a book kept for that purpose together with the names and places of residence of all persons insured and the amount for which each is insured which shall be open for inspection of all members of the corporation from nine o'clock in the forenoon to four o'clock in the afternoon of such days of each week as may be determined by its annual meeting. The board of directors may change the place of the annual meeting of the corporation to any town inside the boundary of its corporate limits notwithstanding its by-laws may designate some particular town as the place for holding such meeting.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 169.

AN ACT to amend section 1937 of Wisconsin statutes of 1898, providing for the cancellation of town mutual insurance company policies.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1937 Wisconsin statutes of 1898 is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 1937. Any member of such corporation may withdraw therefrom at any time by returning his policy with a request for its cancellation written thereon or by a notice in writing over his own signature properly witnessed (one witness) to the president or in his absence to the secre-

tary thereof and paying his share of all claims then existing against said corporation. And the directors, or a majority thereof or such and so many of them as they may have appointed as a committee for such purpose, shall have power to annul any policy by giving notice in writing to that effect to the holder thereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 170.

AN ACT to amend sections 390 and 406a of the Wisconsin statutes, by making the appropriations in such sections contained specific in amount, instead of percentages upon the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Specific appropriation to university; division of, and amounts. Loans from other funds.

SECTION 1. Section 390 of the Wisconsin statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 390. There shall be levied and collected annually, a state tax amounting to the sum of two hundred and sixty-eight thousand dollars, which amount, when so levied and collected, is annually appropriated to the university fund income, to be used as a part thereof, for current or administration expenditures and for the construction in the order of the greatest need therefor of such additional buildings and works and the enlargement and repair of buildings and works as in the judgment of the regents
