CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT amendatory of chapter 99 of the laws of 1891, entitled, "An act conferring civil, criminal and appellate jurisdiction upon the county court of Waukesha county, Wisconsin," and relating to fees of phonographic reporter in said court.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Per diem of reporter. SECTION 1. Chapter 99 of the laws of 1891, is hereby amended by inserting between sections 21 and 22 of said chapter a new section which shall be designated as 21a, and which said section shall read as follows: Section 21a. The county board of said county of Waukesha may in its discretion increase the per diem compensation of such phonographic reporter, provided however it shall in no instance allow as such compensation more than ten dollars per day.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 112.

AN ACT to confer upon county boards in all counties of a population of two hundred and fifty thousand or more the power to alter and regulate the salaries of clerks appointed by the district attorneys in all such counties.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

County board to fix salaries of clerks, when. SECTION 1. The board of supervisors of every county in this state now hav-

ing, or which may hereafter have according to any census theretofore taken, a population of two hundred and fifty thousand or more inhabitants, may, by resolution, at any meeting of the said board of supervisors alter and regulate the compensation of the clerk appointed by the district attorney of such county.

Conflicting laws repealed. SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT providing for a closed season for hunting aquatic fowl and amendatory of section 4563 of the statutes of 1898, as amended by section 1 of chapter 267 of the laws of 1899, and by chapter 449 of the laws of 1903.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Spring shooting. SECTION 1. Section 4563 of the statutes of 1898 as amended by section 1 of chapter 267 of the laws of 1899, and by section 1 of chapter 449 of the laws of 1903, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 4563.* *It shall be unlawful to take, catch, kill, hunt or pursue any wild duck or other aquatic fowl between the first day of January and the succeeding first day of September, or any wild goose or brant between the first day of April and the succeeding first day of September, in any year, or any swan at any time. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the*
