JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

Pertaining to permanent improvement of the upper Mississippi.

WHEREAS, The permanent improvement of the upper Mississippi river, between St. Louis, Mo., and St. Paul, Minn., by maintaining a channel of six feet in depth at low water will be in the interest of commerce and for the benefit of all the people of the five states contiguous,

Resolved by the assembly, (the senate concurring,) That we request the senators and representatives in congress from the state of Wisconsin to approve of and support the request and petition of the Upper Mississippi River Improvement Association now pending before congress, for the improvement.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6.

On the death of Honorable David G. Williams.

WHEREAS, Since the last convening of this legislature death has claimed the Honorable David G. Williams, assemblyman from the second district of Columbia, who departed this life at Cambria, Wisconsin, August 26, 1903,

Resolved, by the assembly, the senate concurring. That in the death of this faithful legislator the state has sustained the loss of a good man and a fearless citizen, and one whose integrity was never questioned, whose honesty was above suspicion, whose private life and short public career were both a credit to himself and source of gratification to his friends.

Resolved, That we, as a body, extend to his bereaved family our heartfelt sympathy in the loss of a kind and indulgent husband and father, and to the state the loss of so faithful a citizen.

Resolved further, That a copy of these resolutions properly enrolled and signed by the speaker and chief clerk of the assembly and by the president and chief clerk of the senate, be presented to the family of the late Honorable David G. Williams.
