Division of judicial matters. SECTION 5. The two county judges of such counties comprehended by this act may act together or separately as they may determine, and make such division of matters in said court as to them appears proper.

Title of judge; powers and duties. SECTION 6^{*}. In all counties having such additional county judge, the judge now in office and his successors shall be known as the county judge of the first division and the other and his successors be known as county judge of the second division. The county judge hereby provided shall be vested with all powers, authority and duties now vested in the county judge in counties included in this act.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 4.

AN ACT to amend section 2, chapter 366, laws of 1891, relating to the municipal court for Dane county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Salary of clerk. SECTION 1. Section 2, chapter 366, laws of 1891 is amended to read as follows: Section 2. There shall be paid to the clerk of said municipal court of Dane county, as salary, * * * the sum of * * * *twelve hundred* dollars per annum, two-thirds of the same to be paid out of the county treasury of Dane county and one-third to be paid out of the treasury of the city of Madison, said salary to be paid * * * monthly and to be in full for all services rendered by said clerk.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
