CHAPTER 86.

AN ACT relating to bonds issued by cities of the first class.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Numbering and signature of bond; statements on its face. SECTION 1. All bonds hereafter issued by cities of the first class, whether organized under general or special charter, shall be numbered consecutively in such manner as the common council of such city may by ordinance prescribe; shall be signed by the mayor and clerk, sealed with the corporate seal, countersigned by the comptroller, and attested by the commissioners of public debt of said city, and each and every bond issued shall show on its face for what purpose and by what authority it was issued, and shall have plainly engraved or printed in figures on some convenient place thereon, a statement of the several amounts of the assessed value of the taxable property in such city for the five several years next preceding the issue of such bonds, and also of the principal sum of the bonded debt of any such city issued and yet outstandingexclusive of bonds heretofore issued by cities of the first class to railroad companies-including the issue of which the bonds bearing such statements shall be a part.
