CHAPTER 178.

AN ACT to appropriate to the State Historical Society money to reimburse it for certain expenditures made necessary by the inadvertent omissions in chapter 533, laws of 1907.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. There is appropriated to the State Historical Society the sum of five thousand dollars out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated to reimburse said society for expenditures for books, periodicals, maps, manuscripts, and kindred articles incurred during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1909, such appropriation being made necessary by the inadvertent omission of the word "annually" in chapter 533 of the laws of 1907.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 179.

AN ACT to create section 2586a of the statutes, prescribing the oath of admission to the bar.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 2586a. Each person admitted to practice as a member of the bar of any court of this state shall subscribe the roll of attorneys to be kept by the clerk and shall in open court take an oath or affirmation of the tenor following, to-wit:

I do solemnly swear:

I will support the constitution of the United States and the constitution of the state of Wisconsin;

I will maintain the respect due to courts of justice and judicial officers:

I will not consent or maintain any suit or proceeding which shall appear to me to be unjust, or any defense, except such as I believe to be honestly debatable under the law of the land;
