quired by law to be taken by justices of the peace in like proceedings; provided that, in case of appeal in civil actions, said reporter when requested by \* \* \* either party shall file a transcribed copy of his notes, which shall be returned as the testimony in the case; and the fees for transcribing said testimony, not exceeding five cents per folio, shall be taxed as part of the costs in the \* \* \* circuit court. Said reporter shall a salary of fifty dollars per month. to be paid receive \* ۰. out of the county treasury as the salaries of other county officers are paid. In all contested cases, a reporter's fee at the · rate of three dollars per day for the time actually consumed on the trial shall be taxed as part of the costs in the case, and shall be in lieu of the fees allowed by law to justices of the peace for taking testimony. Such reporter's fees and all fees for transcribing testimony shall be collected by the county judge and vaid over to the county treasurer in the same manner as he is required by this act to collect and pay over the fees allowed by. law to justices of the peace. Section 2439 of the revised statutes shall apply to said reporter and said court, and section 4141 of the revised statutes shall apply to transcribed copies of the testimony and proceeding taken by the reporter under this act in the county court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 25.

AN ACT to amend section 2424 of the statutes, relating to the term of court in the sixth judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That paragraph of section 2424 of the statutes, prescribing the term of the court for the sixth judicial circuit shall be amended to read: Sixth circuit. In the county of La Crosse, on the second Tuesday in January, the first Tuesday in May, the second Tuesday in September, and the second Tuesday in November, in the county of Monroe, on the third Tuesday in March and the first Tuesday in October; in the county of Trempealeau, on the first Tuesday in March and the third Tuesday in October; in the county of Vernon, on the second Tuesday in June and the second Tuesday in December until the first Monday of January, 1910, and thereafter on the second Tuesday in April and the fourth Tuesday in November.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT to amend subsection 14 of section 69 of the statutes relating to rules for determining the qualifications of voters.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 14 of section 69 of the statutes, is amended to read: 14. Each inmate of any national or state home for soldiers in this state shall be deemed to reside in the town, city or village, in which said home shall be located, and in the election district in which he shall sleep, unless such inmate shall elect to treat his fixed place of residence prior to his bccoming an inmate of such home, as his place of residence.
