

as a police officer of any county or of any city unless he is a citizen of the United States and shall have resided in this state continuously for a period of one year immediately preceding such appointment; provided, that this act shall not apply to or affect any common carrier engaged in interstate or intrastate traffic. Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to any deputy appointed by the sheriff who is not required under the statutes to take an oath of office.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 159.

AN ACT to amend the first paragraph of section 4560a—3 of the statutes, relating to dip nets.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 4560a—3 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 4560a—3. It shall be unlawful and is hereby prohibited to set, use or operate a dip net, in any of the inland waters of this state, except in the streams or rivers flowing into Lake Michigan, \* \* \* within a distance of ten miles of the shore of said lake \* \* \* and in the Milwaukee river within a distance of twenty miles from the shore of said lake, and in the east and west branches of the Fond du Lac river emptying into Lake Winnebago, within three miles of said lake, and in the town of Ripon, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, from the old Arcade dam on Silver creek to the Green Lake county line, and Wolf river and all streams flowing into said river, and in the waters herein enumerated, dip nets not to exceed fourteen feet in diameter with meshes not less than two-inch stretch measure, may be used only for the purpose of taking and catching buffalo fish, carp, eelpout, garfish, red horse and suckers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
