CHAPTER 203.

AN ACT to create section 959-35h of the statutes, relating to the assessment of special assessments, in cities of the first class.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 959—35h. Hereafter in any city of the first class, however incorporated, when any street improvement of any kind is made in any such city and any portion of the cost thereof is assessable as benefits upon the abutting property, in assessing for street work, the center line of the roadway shall be the dividing line between abutting properties on the opposite sides of streets, regardless of whether or not the center line of any such roadway is on the center line of the street.
