the population entitled to school privileges in said city as may be directed and required by the board, • • • and the board of school directors shall appropriate annually a sufficient sum to defray all expenses in connection with the taking of said census of all persons between the ages of four and twenty, residing in said city, and the secretary of the school board shall receive no compensation for such services and he shall submit to the board a detailed statement of his expenses in connection with the taking of the said census, and the same shall be audited by the board and paid out of funds provided for the support of the schools.

SECTION 2.⁺ This act shall take effect September first, 1915. Approved June 10, 1915.

- The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 2 of section 2 of chapter 537 of the laws of 1907, as amended by chapter 316 of the laws of 1909, is amended to read: (Ch. 537, laws of 1907. Section 2) 2. The commission shall remove the existing capitol in parts from time to time as nece-sary, use or dispose of the materials the:eof, as may be most advantageous, and apply any proceeds realized to the cest of such removal or other authorized purpeses.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
