proper officer, and if sealed, that it has the proper seal affixed, except when the law requires an additional certificate of genuineness.

CHAPTER 246.

AN ACT to create section 4565b—10 of the statutes, prohibiting the killing of game birds from automobiles, motor cycles, or any other vehicles, and providing a penalty.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 4565b—10. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to any time pursue, take, catch, kill, hunt or shoot any game bird, as defined in section 4565b—1 of the statutes, with or from any automobile, motor cycle or any other vehicle.

2. Any person violating any of the provisions of subsection 1 of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than ten days nor more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
