ing the same, or upon the amount and quality of the business renewed under his supervision, but in no case shall the aggregate sum so paid in any year exceed the expense limitations imposed by law. No such competition or contests shall be instituted, or any such conditions imposed on renewal commissions or other compensation after the first insurance year, as affecting any business written in this state, unless the plan, with a full statement thereof, has first been filed with the commissioner of insurance.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 332.

AN ACT to amend section 460—4 of the statutes, relating to teachers' insurance and retirement fund.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 460—4 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 460—4. Members of said board shall receive no compensation except their necessary traveling expenses incurred in attending the meetings, to be paid from the teachers' insurance and retirement fund upon the certificate of the president and secretary; but if the board shall elect one of its members secretary, such member shall receive compensation for services rendered as secretary. The secretary of said board shall receive a salary to be fixed by the board, at an amount not to exceed * * cighteen hundred dollars per annum. The compensation of the secretary and any other necessary expenses incurred by said board in carrying out the provisions of sections 460—1 to 460—20, inclusive, shall be paid from the fund.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
