prisonment not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment for the first offense; and by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment for the second offense; and for the third offense the license of such association, copartnership, corporation, doing business under the aforesaid sections, shall be revoked.

Section 2. There are added to section 1691 of the statutes two new subsections to read: (Section 1691) 3a. Before any person, or any association, copartnership, or corporation, heretofore or hereafter created, shall do business under the provisions of section 1691 of the statutes, such person, association, copartnership, or corporation shall first obtain a permit from the commissioner of banking, who is hereby invested with the supervision of said organizations.

4a. The books of account of such person, association, copartnership, or corporation, doing business under the aforesaid section, shall at all times be open to the inspection and examination by the commissioner of banking.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 451.

AN ACT to amend subsection 1 of section 4560a—7 of the statutes, relating to taking fish through the ice on inland lakes.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 1 of section 4560a—7 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 4560a—7) 1. It shall be unlawful, and is hereby prohibited for any person to fish in any manner, through the ice, on Silver Lake, situated within the city limits of Portage, Columbia county; on Pardeeville mill pond, formed by the Fox river, in Columbia county; on Pine Lake, town of Hancock, and on Fish Lake, towns of Hancock and Deerfield, and mill pond in the village of Wautoma, Waushara county; on Lake Nocquebay in Marinette county; on Lake Mason, commonly known as Briggsville pond, situated in the counties of Adams and Marquette; on Shell Lake, situated in Washburn county; on Chain of Lakes, situated in townships thirty-seven and thirty-eight north, of range twelve west, in Washburn county; on Spring Lake and the upper mill lake in

the village and in the town of Palmyra in Jefferson county, in the Big Slough in Lewiston, Columbia county, Wisconsin; on Devils Lake and Mears Lake and tributary streams in Sauk county; on waters known as "Koenig's Millpond," situated in sections seven, eight, seventeen and eighteen of township nine north of range six east, town of Prairie du Sac, and Mirror Lake in Sauk county, and Twin lakes located in the township of Lincoln, Polk County, before the first day of March, A. D. 1917; or on any lake in Langlade, or Marquette county, or in Phantom Lake and Howitt's Lake in Waukesha county, before the first day of November, A. D. 1921; or to spear fish in any manner during any season of the year in Lake Mason, commonly known as Briggsville pond, or the inlet, outlet or marshes adjacent to the same, or in Pine Lake in town of Hancock, and Fish Lake in towns of Hancock and Deerfield, Waushara county, or in the Chain of Lakes, Mirror or Shadow lakes, in the towns of Farmington, Dayton and the city of Waupaca and the town of Waupaca, Waupaca county, Wisconsin, or in Devils Lake in Sauk county, or in waters known as "Koenig's Millpond," situated in sections seven, eight, seventeen and eighteen of township nine north of range six east, town of Prairie du Sac, and Mirror Lake in Sauk county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 452.

AN ACT to authorize and instruct the commissioners of public lands to convey to A. Garfield Gunderson and Oscar Langberg certain lands therein described.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The commissioners of public lands are authorized and instructed to convey to A. Garfield Gunderson and Oscar-Langberg of Dunn county certain lands now occupied by them in Dunn county, Wisconsin, described as follows, to wit: The northeast quarter of the southwest quarter of section numbersix, township number twenty-nine north, range number eleven west, for the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars.
