AN ACT to amend section 927-13a of the statutes, as created by chapter 390, laws of 1915, relating to elections in villages and in cities of the fourth class on purchase, lease or construction of waterworks and lighting plants.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 927-13a of the statutes, as created by chapter 390, laws of 1915, is amended to read: Section 927-13a. In villages or in cities of the fourth class elections under the provisions of section 927-1 or of section 927-13 of the statutes shall not be held oftener than once a year; provided, however, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any such village or city of the fourth class in which any proceedings were begun and pending, or any steps were taken, to hold any such election, prior to, or at the time of, the publication of said chapter 390, laws of 1915.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## **CHAPTER 592.**

AN ACT to amend subsections 1 and 2 of section 172-7 of the statutes, making appropriation for the attorney-general and reverting unexpended balances to the general fund.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsections 1 and 2 of section 172-7 of the statutes, are amended to read: (Section 172-7.) 1. There is annually appropriated, beginning July 1, • • • 1915, thirty thousand \* \* \* dollars, payable from any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, as a general appropriation for the attorney-general, to carry into effect the powers, duties and functions provided by law for said officer.

2. There is annually appropriated, beginning July 1, 1915, not to exceed five thousand dollars, payable from any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, as a contingent appropriation for the attorney-general to carry into effect the powers, duties and functions provided by law for \* \* said officer.
