CHAPTER 89.

AN ACT to amend subsection 3 of section 1548 of the statutes, relating to liquor licenses.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Subsection 3 of section 1548 of the statutes is SECTION 1. amended to read: (Section 1548) 3. The application for any such license shall be in writing, and shall state the kind of license applied for and designate the premises where such liquor shall be sold. All such licenses shall remain in force until the first day of July next after the granting thereof, unless sooner revoked by the board or council granting the same; they shall be attested by the town, city or village clerk, and shall not be delivered until the applicant shall produce and file with the clerk a receipt showing the payment of the sum required therefor to the proper treasurer, and until the filing with the clerk of the bond provided for in section 1549. If any licensee shall die during any license year, the administrator of such deceased licensee may continue or sell said business and if he sells the same. may assign or transfer such license and all rights and privileges of the licensee thereunder, if the transferee or assignee is acceptable to the licensing authorities and secures their consent thereto and fully complies with the requirements of law applicable to original applicants and executes and delivers a satisfactory bond. No such assignment or transfer shall be permitted unless a fee of twenty-five dollars is paid therefor to the town, city or village, as the case may be.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 90.

AN ACT to formally accept, for and on behalf of the state of Wisconsin, title to certain lands situated in the town of Delafield, Waukesha county, Wisconsin, heretofore conveyed by deed to the state.

Whereas, The legislature of the State of Wisconsin, by chapter 561, laws of 1911, appropriated five thousand dollars for the erection of a monument to the memory of William B. Cushing, to be erected at his birthplace in the town of Delafield, Waukesha county; and
