

3. At the time so fixed the said board shall meet and hear all such objections, and for that purpose may adjourn from day to day, not more than three days, and may by resolution modify such assessment in whole or in part. At any time before the first day of November thereafter any party liable may pay any such tax to the village treasurer. On such first day of November, if any such tax remains unpaid, the village treasurer shall make a certified statement showing what taxes so levied remain unpaid, and file the same with the village clerk, who shall extend the same upon the tax roll of such village, in addition to and as part of all other village taxes therein levied on such land, to be collected therewith.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 182

AN ACT to amend section 919cc of the statutes, relating to the power of villages in counties containing one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants or more, to borrow money and issue bonds for certain purposes therefor.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 919cc is amended to read: Section 919cc. In all villages situated in counties containing one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants or more, the president and trustees may, for the purpose of the construction of main sewers, *surface or storm water sewers*, waterworks and electric lights and other parts of the work chargeable to the general fund provided for in this section, including all other municipal purposes for which bonds may be issued, borrow money to the amount of five per cent of the assessed valuation of the real and personal property in such village and issue negotiable corporate bonds therefor in the manner provided in sections 942 and 943 of the statutes. The proceeds of the sale of the said bonds shall be devoted and appropriated exclusively to the construction and maintenance of *such* sewers, waterworks, and electric lighting, including all other municipal purposes for which bonds may be issued, as in this section provided and shall be known as the general fund. The village treasurer shall not pay out any of said fund for any purpose other than the construction and maintenance of *such* sewers, waterworks and electric lighting and other municipal

purposes for which bonds may be issued, as in this section provided.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 183

AN ACT to amend sections 925—5 and 925—12 of the statutes, relating to letters patent to cities.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections 925—5 and 925—12 of the statutes are amended to read: Section 925—5. If said ordinance be adopted the result shall be certified under the corporate seal of the city to the secretary of state, together with a copy of all the proceedings relating thereto and the result of the census taken for the purpose of determining the classification of said city; thereupon the governor shall issue letters patent under the great seal, * * * constituting the * * * city a body corporate and politic by the name of the city of ----- (specifying the name of such city) and declaring that the same shall be governed by the provisions of this chapter applicable to the cities of the ----- class (specifying the class); provided, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent any city now incorporated and existing from adopting the provisions of this chapter regardless of its present population.

Section 925—12. The result of the election as canvassed by the inspectors shall be returned to the clerk of such village, if it be incorporated, otherwise to the clerk of such town. If a majority of the votes are cast in favor of the city charter said clerk shall certify the fact to the secretary of state, together with the result of the census taken, if any, and thereupon a patent shall be issued as provided in section 925—5. * * *

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
